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## FISCAL IMPACT

No net fiscal impact. The proposed action will increase the FY2009 Capital Budget by a net amount of \$245,000 and recognize FTA Section 5307 funds in the same amount.

## **DISCUSSION**

RT's annual budgeting process includes Board adoption of budgets that reflect RT's expected funding at the time of preparation. Periodically, additional funding sources become available that require revisions to the project budgets. Staff has identified such revisions due to recent funding authorizations on various projects that will require Board action.

On April 30, 2009, FTA published its Supplemental FY 2009 Apportionments and Allocations which were slightly higher than the estimated FY 2009 apportionments for the FTA Section 5307 Urbanized Area and 5309 Fixed Guideway Modernization formula funds. In May, the additional amounts were allocated to the Sacramento region transit agencies including RT. Attachment 1 reflects the budget changes to FY 2009 projects resulting from the additional allocations to RT and its subrecipient transit agencies approved by the Board June 22, 2009.

Attachment 1 shows \$100,000 budgeted for FY09 Preventive Maintenance for the City of Folsom. The correct amount is \$415,000. Attachment 1 also shows \$200,000 budgeted for FY09 ADA Operations for the city of Folsom. The correct amount is \$130,000.

Staff seeks Board approval of these proposed capital budget changes summarized in Exhibit A.

#### **ISSUE**

Whether or not to approve RT's List of Authorized Classifications, Positions and Salary Grades.

#### RECOMMENDED ACTION

Adopt Resolution No. 09-08-\_\_\_\_, Amending Exhibit A of Resolution No. 09-06-0098, and Approving RT's List of Authorized Classifications, Positions and Salary Grades.

#### FISCAL IMPACT

The Fiscal Year 2010 Operating Budget impact is \$18,676 and the Capital Budget impact is \$74,704. The ongoing annualized Operating budget impact is \$28,000 and the Capital Budget impact is \$112,000.

#### DISCUSSION

#### **Engineering and Construction Division**

In February 2009, the Board approved the new job descriptions developed by the Waters Consulting Group including the new job description of Principal Systems Engineer; however, no positions were authorized at that level. Due to the advancement of the South Sacramento Corridor Phase 2 (SSCP2) project and the upcoming technical capacity and capability review by the Federal Transit Administration (FTA), staff has determined that a Principal Systems Engineer is necessary to provide the level of technical experience acceptable to the FTA and to provide a leadership and mentoring role needed to augment the department. Without authorization of this position, there is a risk that the FTA may not approve advancement of the project through to final design.

There are currently two (2) vacancies in the Systems Design Department for Senior Systems Engineers. Staff is requesting that the Board approve a change to the number of authorized positions to eliminate one (1) vacant Senior Systems Engineer position and add one (1) Principal Systems Engineer position.

Changes to position control are reflected in the Authorized Classifications, Positions and Salary Grades List, attached as Exhibit A to the Resolution.

Staff recommends approval of this action.

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#### **ISSUE**

Whether to approve accepting a California Capital Airshow admission ticket as fare equivalent on Saturday, September 12, 2009 and Sunday, September 13, 2009.

#### RECOMMENDED ACTION

Adopt Resolution No. 09-08-\_\_\_\_, Approving California Capital Airshow Admission Tickets as Fare Equivalent on September 12, 2009 and September 13, 2009.

#### FISCAL IMPACT

The California Capital Airshow Foundation (CCAS) has agreed to reimburse RT up to \$60,000 for the estimated loss of fare revenue, and for the cost of additional security, supervision and crowd control during the two-day event. CCAS has contracted separately for bus service from the Mather Field/Mills light rail station to Mather Airport.

#### DISCUSSION

The 2009 California Capital Airshow at Mather Airport will feature performances by the U.S. Air Force Air Demonstration Squadron, the Thunderbirds. In addition, the airshow will also host an array of military and law enforcement aircraft, aerobatic and specialty performers. The show is expected to draw an estimated 100,000 attendees over the weekend. In an effort to alleviate heavy traffic congestion and parking hassles, the CCAS and RT are working together to once again provide quality, seamless transit service to this year's event. To encourage airshow attendees to use transit, CCAS has requested that RT accept pre-purchased airshow admission tickets as pre-paid fare on September 12 and 13, 2009.

CCAS and RT staff will actively promote pre-sale admission tickets and transit as a preferred transportation option. This is a great opportunity for RT to help build future ridership by promoting and, in many cases, introducing transit to a key segment of people that may not regularly be exposed to public transportation and its many benefits.

# General Manager's Report August 10, 2009

#### FEDERAL UPDATE

#### Reauthorization

Last week, Congress moved quickly and both the House and Senate voted in succession to approve the three-part package that includes the addition of \$7 billion to keep the highway trust fund solvent. Made up of revenue from fuel taxes drivers pay at the pump, the highway trust fund is the \$40 billion source the federal government uses to spend on roads, bridges and transit projects. This funding addresses the immediate shortfall and after President Obama's signature will keep the highway trust fund solvent through September 30<sup>th</sup>. The larger question of when a full reauthorization will occur remains. The administration is still searching for solutions to determine how best to finance the current surface transportation bill, which expires at the end of September.

#### **Appropriations**

On July 23<sup>rd</sup>, the U.S. House of Representatives passed its version of the Transportation, Housing and Urban Development Fiscal Year 2010 Appropriations Bill which included approximately \$40 million for the Sacramento South Corridor light rail extension. On July 30<sup>th</sup>, the Senate Appropriations Committee approved the Fiscal Year 2010 transportation bill that contains \$40 million in funding under mass transit construction for the South Sacramento Light Rail Extension. \$40 million of funding for the South Corridor have now been included in the President's budget and both the House and Senate THUD committee bills. This places the District in a good position for the 2010 Transportation, Housing and Urban Development Appropriations Conference Report likely to be vetted in November.

## STATE UPDATE

On July 28, Governor Arnold Schwarzenegger signed the state budget.

AB 729 (Evans) – Transit Design-Build Contracts, extends the sunset date for transit operators to enter into design-build contracts to January 1, 2015. The current authority is set to expire as of January 1, 2011. The measure would allow transit providers to maintain a tool that may help expedite capital projects made available through allocations from Proposition 1B or the federal economic stimulus package. This bill is in the Senate Appropriations Committee. Pending approval there, the bill is eligible for consideration by the full Senate.

AB 1072 (Eng), allows for long-range planning and contracting on the part of transit operators by locking in the formula on all remaining funds in the Public Transportation Modernization, Improvement and Service Enhancement (PTMISEA) program – Approved by the Senate Housing and Transportation Committee. This bill also contains an expenditure program mechanism, whereby agencies would be required to submit an expenditure plan for their share of the remaining funds available, in order to support advocacy for sufficient annual appropriations from the PTMISEA. Furthermore, the measure would allow recipients to "bank" their allocations over multiple years so that they can accumulate funds for large high-priority projects, and permit borrowing between agencies to ensure that each allocated dollar is being utilized. This bill is in the

Senate Appropriations Committee. Pending approval there, the bill is eligible for consideration by the full Senate.

SB 716 (Wolk)-Farm Worker Vanpools. In Assembly Transportation Committee.

ACA 15 (Arambula) and ACA 9 (Huffman)-lowers the voter threshold from two-thirds to 55%. ACA 15 is on the Assembly floor. ACA 9 passed the Assembly Revenue and Tax Committee and is in the Assembly Appropriations Committee waiting to be heard. No update.
