DISCUSSION

On November 13, 2006, the Board awarded a contract to Psomas in the amount of \$1,500,000 for General Engineering Support Services (GESS).

The General Engineering Support Services (GESS) contract provides for on-call support for various capital construction projects on portions of the light rail system and bus facilities. The scope of work includes various disciplines of engineering, traffic engineering, architectural and landscape design, surveying and right of way, right of way engineering, real estate services and estimating. The support services will be provided over a three-year period, ending December 31, 2009, for a variety of work tasks to be performed on a Work Order basis.

As a work order is assigned to Psomas or its subconsultants, it is charged against the GESS budget. However, if a project has a budget line item for the task being performed by a Work Order, the expense incurred is charged against the individual project budget, not the GESS budget; however, the expense is still charged against the contract not-to-exceed amount.

The amount of the GESS contract was previously amended to \$4,000,000. Based on GESS budget amounts accumulated during previous fiscal years, staff anticipated expending approximately \$825,000 per year for this contract. McClellan, the 65th Street Station Improvements, and the Downtown Natomas Airport MOS1 Design Build project, the contract not-to-exceed amount of \$4,000,000 will soon be reached. The GESS contract has provided critical engineering support for RT capital projects for Engineering, Real Estate and Facilities.

Staff proposes to increase the contract not-to-exceed amount by \$1,000,000 to bring the total contract amount to \$5,000,000. There is no change in the scope of services nor any change to the 3-year term for this Contract.

Staff recommends approval of the Fifth Amendment to the Contract with Psomas which increases the total consideration by \$1,000,000 to \$5,000,000.

DISCUSSION

In 2007, RT entered into a relationship with Google Inc. to provide transit scheduling and itinerary planning services to the general public for RT's rail and bus services. After working with Google staff and going into production with RT's "Google Trip Planner", staff determined that it would be possible for RT to collect service, stop, and schedule data for other regional transit agencies then provide this data to Google to effect seamless regional itinerary planning using their service.

In 2008, with the assistance of SACOG staff, RT's IT and Scheduling staff approached the other transit agencies in the Sacramento region in an attempt to assist them with consolidating their service data and providing it to Google as a regional trip planning initiative. To date, RT has executed agreements with UniTrans, Roseville Transit, Placer County Transit, Yolo County Transit, and Yuba-Sutter Transit to act as their agent with respect to providing service data to Google for trip planning services.

Subject: Approving a Subrecipient Agreement with SACOG For Congestion Mitigation Air Quality Funds and Amending RT's FY 2010 Capital Budget

SAGOG has been awarded Congestion Mitigation Air Quality Funds (CMAQ) administered through the California Department of Transportation ("Caltrans"), to implement and support 511 Automated Transit Trip Planning systems. This funding has provisions for subrecipient reimbursement of expenses, and is compatible with RT's regional Google trip planning project. SACOG has programmed \$127,125 of their 511/trip planning CMAQ funding as a pass through to RT as reimbursable expenses for staff time and system impact mitigation, requiring matching funds in the amount of \$16,471. This match is provided from IT's 2010 operating budget. \$16,471 will be transferred from IT's operating budget to the capital project as allowed under RT Resolution No. 09-02-0031.

Staff seeks the Board's approval of the subrecipient agreement with SAGOG in order to allow SACOG to pass through CMAQ funding for reimbursement of staff time and system expenses related to the Google regional trip planning project.

ISSUE

Whether to approve an Easement Agreement with the Sacramento-Placerville Transportation Corridor Joint Powers Authority (JPA), Sacramento Regional Transit District (RT) and Sacramento Area Sewer District (SASD) for a sewer line within RT's right of way at Alabama Avenue between Folsom Boulevard and Atlanta Avenue.

RECOMMENDED ACTION

Adopt Resolution No. 09-07-_____, Approving Easement Agreement for a Sewer Line Within the Sacramento-Placerville Transportation Corridor Joint Powers Authority, Sacramento Regional Transit District and Sacramento Area Sewer District at Alabama Avenue Between Folsom Boulevard and Atlanta Avenue.

FISCAL IMPACT

Approval of the Easement Agreement would result in RT receiving a one-time fee of \$5,655.

DISCUSSION

The subject property is within the Sacramento-Placerville Transportation Corridor Joint Powers Authority's (JPA) rail right of way, over which Sacramento Regional Transit District (RT) has an easement interest. This property is located in the vicinity of Alabama Avenue between Folsom Boulevard and Atlanta Avenue (see Attachment "A") and is further identified as Sacramento County Tax Assessor Parcel Number: 072-0231-033.

Sacramento Area Sewer District (SASD), a Sacramento County Sanitation District has requested to install and maintain a 10-foot diameter sewer line approximately 104 feet in length via transverse underground at a minimum depth of 6 feet below within RT's right of way. Attachment "B" shows the location of the sewer line to be installed by SASD.

Pursuant to the terms of the Easement Agreement, the JPA will grant SASD an easement in gross over the area within the rail right of way that houses the sewer line. The easement interest is in perpetuity and RT will receive a one-time payment of \$5,655 for the interest, which represents the assessed market value of the easement interest.

Staff recommends approval of the Easement Agreement between the JPA, RT and SASD for the installation of the sewer line within the rail right of way in the Amtrak/Folsom Corridor.


