DISCUSSION

On January 12, 2009, the Board gave authorization for staff to release a Request for Proposals (RFP) for Community Relations Services for the South Sacramento Corridor Phase 2 Project. Staff released the RFP on February 16, 2009 and the solicitation was advertised in publications of general circulation and posted on RT's website under Contracting Opportunities. A pre-proposal meeting was held on March 2, 2009; one Addendum and Letter of Clarifications was issued. On March 18, 2009, four responsive proposals were received from: AIM Consulting, CirclePoint, HDR / The Hoyt Company, and PMC.

The qualifying criteria in the RFP included the Proposer's understanding of the project, staffing and experience, project work plan, and competitiveness of price. The Selection Committee scored the written proposals, short listed, and invited two firms to oral presentations, which were held on April 1, 2009.

Following oral presentations, CirclePoint was chosen by the selection committee to provide Community Relations services for the South Sacramento Corridor Phase 2 project. CirclePoint was chosen due to strengths in their staffing and written proposal, as well as an excellent oral presentation. This firm has a strong understanding of this light rail project, brings the necessary

talent, and has previous experience doing light rail outreach with RT. CirclePoint has expert knowledge of strategies for effective consensus building and outreach to multiple stakeholders during the planning, design, and construction phases of major transportation infrastructure projects. They are experts with comprehensive experience in the development and implementation of public outreach programs for rail and station design and construction projects. They have experience with cross-cultural community relations and outreach programs that take into account differences in language and cultural heritage. This team thoroughly identified many challenges RT will face in the project area and are the only firm that proposed alternative methods of outreach such as Facebook and Twitter in addition to traditional outreach efforts.

The Selection Committee consisted of: Diane Nakano, AGM of Engineering and Construction; Greg Gamble, Director of Construction Management; Ed Scofield, Community and Governmental Affairs Manager and Acting Project Manager for the SSCP2 Project; and Jo Noble, Senior Community and Government Affairs Officer.

RT established a 25% participation goal for small business enterprises (SBE) for this contract. To be eligible for Contract award, the Proposer must have either met this SBE participation goal or demonstrated good faith efforts to do so in order to be deemed responsive and responsible and eligible for Contract award. CirclePoint and its subcontractors, EMRL (graphic design services), and AvantPage (translation services) are all certified SBE's with the State of California Department of General Services. Therefore, 100% SBE participation is achieved with CirclePoint.

Services under this Contract will be performed by issuing Work Orders for the purpose of assisting staff with managing a variety of activities and to control cash flow, during slow and peak timelines, throughout the life of the project.

Staff recommends the Board award a contract for Community Relations Services for the South Sacramento Corridor Phase 2 Project, to CirclePoint, for a not to exceed amount of \$400,000.

DISCUSSION

RT contracts with both the City and the County of Sacramento for Peace Officer Assignment for enhanced security on RT's buses, trains, and related transit facilities and rights of way. RT's Police Services Department is authorized one (1) Police Lieutenant, two (2) Police Sergeants. twenty (20) Police Officers, one (1) Sheriff Sergeant, and ten (10) Sheriff Deputies. Due to budget constraints, there are currently four (4) sworn officer vacancies (three Police Officers and one Sheriff Deputy).

The current agreement (Resolution #08-06-0069) with the City of Sacramento for Peace Officer Assignment expires June 30, 2009. Staff is proposing that RT enter into a two year agreement for Peace Officer Services.

The billing rates for FY10 and the first half of FY11 (July 1 to December 31, 2010) are the same as the FY09 billing rates because the Sacramento Police Officers Association (SPOA) approved an agreement with the City to extend its labor contract and defer a previously negotiated 5% salary increase. The second half of FY11 (January 1 to June 30, 2011) includes a 2% salary increase for the Sergeants and Police Officers. The cost of one Police Lieutenant, two Police

DISCUSSION

On August 20, 2008, Lockwood, Andrews & Newnam, Inc (LAN) entered into the contract for Civil, Track and Structures Design Services for the South Sacramento Corridor Phase 2 (SSCP2) Project. The SSCP2 Project is a 4.3-mile extension of the existing South Sacramento Corridor Phase I project, and will begin at Meadowview Station and end at Cosumnes River College.

On January 26, 2009, the Board approved the first amendment to the Contract to allow LAN to perform additional geotechnical, environmental and survey work prior to the rainy season and dormant season for the giant garter snake. That work allowed a more timely design process and took advantage of field consultants that were mobilized, allowing RT to acquire design information in an expeditious manner.
