### **PURPOSE** (Lonergan, Sakauye)

The purpose of Senate Bill 1561 is to enhance safety and system security. This Bill allows Sacramento Regional Transit District and Fresno Area Express to exclude passengers from using transit for limited periods of time, depending on the nature and the frequency of offenses committed while on transit district property and for which they have been cited. This will not target or adversely impact any particular group of individuals.

The bill also provides for an appeals process should individuals who are transit-dependent be cited, and for training of transit personnel to recognize and facilitate the needs of those experiencing homelessness or who may have psychiatric disabilities. The bill outlines the composition and duties of an oversight committee to monitor the number of citations and exclusions issued by the transit district. This committee would also oversee the training of transit personnel in dealing with those passengers with special needs. If successful, RT will seek to strengthen the law and search for "best practices" nationwide.

### **HISTORY** (Lonergan)

In recent years, the Sacramento Regional Transit (RT) Board of Directors and staff have received a number of complaints from riders regarding the safety of RT vehicles, parking lots and passenger waiting areas. In February 2007, Police Services' Sergeants went on a site visit to Portland, Oregon's Tri-Met. Officials at Tri-Met credited an increase in passenger satisfaction to the enactment of their "Exclusion Rule". Out of this visit, the idea for Senate Bill 1561, modeled after the successful Tri-Met Program, was born. By excluding passengers cited or arrested for certain offenses, as outlined in the bill, RT seeks to reduce the number of passenger disruptions and improve overall service. To encourage ridership and to reduce emissions associated with daily commuting, potential passengers need to feel that RT is a safe alternative to driving. The amended language of this bill resulted from meetings of a task force whose membership included persons with experience in the areas of mental health, homelessness, public safety and transportation, as well as a review of current state and local laws pertaining to rail and bus transit.

### **LAW** (Legal)

This bill would authorize the Sacramento Regional Transit District to issue a prohibition order to any person cited for committing one or more of certain prohibited acts and under various other circumstances under a trial period. The prohibition order would prohibit the person subject to the order from entering the property, facilities, or vehicles of the transit district for specified periods of time up to one year. There are limitations to this law.

What can be excluded per Senate Bill 1561 (effective 1/1/2009 thru 1/1/2012):

On at least three separate occasions within a period of 60 consecutive days, the person is cited for an infraction committed in or on a vehicle, bus stop, or light rail station of the transit district for any act that is a violation of:

- 99170(a)(2) PUC Interfere with the operator or operation of a transit vehicle, or impede the safe boarding or alighting of passengers.
- 99170(a)(5) PUC Commit any act or engage in any behavior that may, with reasonable foresee ability, cause harm or injury to any person or property.
- 640(b)(6) PC Willfully disturbing others on or in a system facility or vehicle by engaging in boisterous or unruly behavior.
- 640(b)(7) PC Carrying an explosive or acid, flammable liquid, or toxic or hazardous material in a public transit facility or vehicle.
- 640(b)(8) PC Urinating or defecating in a system facility or vehicle, except in a lavatory. However, this paragraph shall not apply to a person who cannot comply with this paragraph as a result of a disability, age, or a medical condition.
- 640(b)(9)(A) PC Willfully blocking the free movement of another person in a system facility or vehicle.
- 640.5(a)(1) PC Any person who defaces with graffiti or other inscribed material the interior or exterior of the facilities or vehicles.

#### OR

The person is <u>arrested or convicted for a misdemeanor or felony</u> committed in or on a vehicle, bus stop, or light rail station of the transit district for acts involving violence, threats of violence, lewd or lascivious behavior, or possession for sale or sale of a controlled substance.

### OR

The person is <u>convicted</u> of a violation of:


11532(a) H&S - It is unlawful for any person to loiter...intent to engage in drug-related activity.

#### OR

The person is convicted of a violation of:

653.22 PC - (a) It is unlawful for any person to loiter in any public place with the intent to commit prostitution.

### **COMMITTEE** (Possible Committee Member or Lonergan)

### Task:

The advisory committee shall be composed of at least five members appointed by the legislative body of the transit district. At least one of the members of the advisory committee shall have experience working with individuals with psychiatric, developmental, or other disabilities and at least one member shall be a youth advocate.

The advisory committee shall be tasked, at a minimum, with all of the following:

- (1) Providing recommendations, in consultation with the county mental health director within the service area of the transit district, regarding the type and extent of training that should be undertaken by individuals with responsibility for issuance and enforcement of prohibition orders, with particular emphasis on training designed to assist those individuals in identifying and interacting with persons who are homeless or who have psychiatric, developmental, or other disabilities.
- (2) Identifying, in consultation with the county mental health director within the service area of the transit district, services and programs to which persons who are homeless or who have psychiatric, developmental, or other disabilities may be referred by transit district enforcement personnel prior to or in conjunction with issuance of a prohibition order.
- (3) Monitoring the issuance of prohibition orders to assist the transit district in ensuring compliance with Section 51 of the Civil Code. (See Reference A)
- (4) Providing the governing board of the transit district and the Legislature with an annual report summarizing the number of prohibition orders that were issued by the transit district during the preceding year, including, but not limited to, the types and numbers of citations by category, and the number of exclusion orders appealed, the appeals granted, the reasons granted, and other relevant information directly related to those orders.

### **CITATION PROCESS** (Voska, Carter)

The following individuals can write citations:

- Transportation Supervisors (Bus and Light Rail)
- Transit Officers
- Peace Officers

On the third separate occasion that an individual receives a qualifying citation (also known as Notice to Appear) within a period of 60 consecutive days, a prohibition order will be issued.

A prohibition order will be issued on the first occasion for qualifying arrests or convictions of misdemeanors and felonies, or convicted of 11532(a) H&S, or convicted for 653.22 PC –(a). See LAW portion above for more definition.

#### **Initial Review of this Prohibition Order**

You are entitled to request an informal review of this Prohibition Order by RT's Exclusion Administrator. An initial review must be requested no later than 5 p.m. on the tenth (10) day after the Notice of Prohibition Order was personally served. This request may be made by telephone, in writing or in person by contacting the Exclusion Administrator at: 1400 29th Street, Sacramento, CA 95816, or by calling (916) 556-0165.

The Exclusion Administrator will issue a decision to uphold, modify or cancel the Prohibition Order. See RT's Administrative Rules and Procedures for additional information.

### Right to an Appeal Hearing Following the Initial Review

You are entitled to appeal the decision of the Exclusion Administrator to a Hearing Officer. Any individual who has received a Notice of Prohibition Order following an initial review, must contact the Exclusion Administrator by 5 p.m. no later than the tenth (10) calendar day following service of the Exclusion Administrator's decision in order to request a hearing before a Hearing Officer. The request may be made by telephone, in writing or in person by contacting the Exclusion Administrator at: 1400 29th Street, Sacramento, CA 95816 or by calling (916) 556-0165.

You will be contacted by the Hearing Officer to schedule a hearing which may be conducted by mail or in person. The decision of the Hearing Officer shall be issued five (5) days following the hearing. All decisions issued by the Hearing Officer shall be subject to judicial review by the Sacramento Superior Court as provided by Code of Civil Procedure section 1094.6, if filed within 90 days of the personal service of the Hearing Officer's decision.



### TRACKING AND DOCUMENTATION (Carter, DeMello)

- 1. Qualifying citation and arrest information are entered into a tracking database.
- 2. From the citation database, a weekly report is created that lists individuals with two or more qualifying citations within a period of 60 consecutive days.
- 3. Notification will be given to departments that cite (Transportation, Light Rail and Police Services), of individuals that have two or more qualifying citations.

### APPEAL PROCESS (Legal, McKinney, Bevins)


Attendance Control Supervisors Glenda McKinney and Sue Bevins have been designated as RT Hearing Officers or Exclusion Administrators to review Exclusion Appeals. Every Prohibition Order issued by an exclusion officer shall be subject to the review of an RT Exclusion Administrator. An Exclusion Administrator shall review each Notice of Prohibition Order to determine whether:

- (a) the Notice of Prohibition Order is filled out completely and in a manner that permits a determination of validity;
- (b) whether the Notice of Prohibition Order conforms to these Rules.
- (c) whether the sufficiency of the narrative support submitted by the issuing officer warrants further review, and
- (d) whether the exclusion has been issued to a person not eligible for a complete exclusion under the circumstance(s).

Every person issued a Notice of Prohibition Order is entitled to a hearing as a matter of right. The purpose of the hearing is:

- (a) to review and determine whether the evidentiary basis for issuance of the prohibition order is sufficient as a matter of law;
- (b) to determine whether the length and scope of the exclusion is commensurate with the nature of the violation;
- (c) to render a finding on whether it is more probable than not that the individual engaged in conduct justifying the exclusion;
- (d) consider any mitigating and aggravating factors relevant to the scope and length of the exclusion;
- (e) and issue a final decision to sustain, modify, or set aside a Notice of Prohibition Order. All persons receiving a prohibition order shall receive notice of their right to a hearing on the Notice of Prohibition Order.

### POLICE SERVICES UPDATE

### California Civil Code Section 51

- (a) This section shall be known, and may be cited, as the Unruh Civil Rights Act.
- (b) All persons within the jurisdiction of this state are free and equal, and no matter what their sex, race, color, religion, ancestry, national origin, disability, medical condition, marital status, or sexual orientation are entitled to the full and equal accommodations, advantages, facilities, privileges, or services in all business establishments of every kind whatsoever.
- (c) This section shall not be construed to confer any right or privilege on a person that is conditioned or limited by law or that is applicable alike to persons of every sex, color, race, religion, ancestry, national origin, disability, medical condition, marital status, or sexual orientation.
- (d) Nothing in this section shall be construed to require any construction, alteration, repair, structural or otherwise, or modification of any sort whatsoever, beyond that construction, alteration, repair, or modification that is otherwise required by other provisions of law, to any new or existing establishment, facility, building, improvement, or any other structure, nor shall anything in this section be construed to augment, restrict, or alter in any way the authority of the State Architect to require construction, alteration, repair, or modifications that the State Architect otherwise possesses pursuant to other laws.
- (e) For purposes of this section:
  - (1) "Disability" means any mental or physical disability as defined in Sections 12926 and 12926.1 of the Government Code.
  - (2) "Medical condition" has the same meaning as defined in subdivision (h) of Section 12926 of the Government Code.
  - (3) "Religion" includes all aspects of religious belief, observance, and practice.
  - (4) "Sex" has the same meaning as defined in subdivision (p) of Section 12926 of the Government Code.
  - (5) "Sex, race, color, religion, ancestry, national origin, disability, medical condition, marital status, or sexual orientation" includes a perception that the person has any particular characteristic or characteristics within the listed categories or that the person is associated with a person who has, or is perceived to have, any particular characteristic or characteristics within the listed categories.
  - (6) "Sexual orientation" has the same meaning as defined in subdivision (q) of Section 12926 of the Government Code.
- (f) A violation of the right of any individual under the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990 (Public Law 101-336) shall also constitute a violation of this section.
