Mike Wiley verbalized his written report. Mr. Wiley noted that the Cap to Cap transportation team included 45 - 50 members with some cross-over members from other teams. Mr. Wiley met with authorizing and appropriations staff from the House and the Senate. Mr. Wiley indicated that the staffs had a clear understanding that there is a transportation cliff with respect to the reauthorization of MAP21, and understand that the biggest challenge is funding and funding levels; there will have to be some additional source of revenue in order to continue to fund the transportation program at the current level when MAP 21 expires and it is renewed. There is also an understanding that there is significant need for transportation funding at the federal level. RT staff heard active conversation from staff that represents both sides of potential funding sources that will be considered. The transportation team met with Peter Rogoff discussing MAP21, RT's projects, and the Streetcar connection between West Sacramento and downtown Sacramento. Mr. Wiley along with representatives from other California transit systems, met with the staffs of Senators Feinstein and Boxer, and Congressman Miller specifically, to talk about the Department of Labor and 13(c) issues in California.

Director Cohn noted that most of the discussion with Mr. Rogoff centered on the draft criteria and the small starts program. The concern expressed by a number of the small and medium sized cities is that the criterion seems to favor very large metro areas like New York or Chicago. Mr. Rogoff indicated that he intends to keep projects moving forward as long as they have a medium or above rating. Mr. Rogoff noted that for the first time the FTA will be short of money this year.

Mark Lonergan provided the results of the Raildeo which occurred on April 13th. The winner from the Raildeo will represent RT in Philadelphia at the International Raildeo. The operators that won were Danai Lambert (first place) and David Becker (second place). The maintenance side that won was Scot Rutherford (first place), Rick Mibach (second place), and Kevin Anderson (third place).
