DISCUSSION

RT contracts with both the City and the County of Sacramento for Peace Officer Assignment for enhanced security on RT's buses, trains, and related transit facilities and rights of way. The RT Peace Officers use police vehicles, purchased by RT, for patrol. The vehicles are equipped with Mobile Data Computers (MDC) that give the Peace Officers access to the State of California Law Enforcement Telecommunications System database as well as Sacramento City and County Law Enforcement databases. These various databases provide information regarding vehicle registration, outstanding warrants, stolen property, police records information and drivers license information.

The Sacramento Police Department (SPD) is currently in the process of upgrading its patrol vehicles with the NextGen MDC systems and In Car Cameras (ICC) systems. In order for RT to provide a seamless interface to the City's MDC and ICC systems, RT's police vehicles need to be equipped with the same equipment as the SPD patrol vehicles. A total of 23 ICC systems and 20 MDC systems need to be installed in the RT police vehicles. The total cost to upgrade RT's police vehicles is \$357,363. The City has agreed to pay for one-half of the project total so long as RT reimburses the City for the remaining half. If the Board approves this proposal, RT will pay \$178,682 for the work.
