GOVERNMENT AFFAIRS UPDATE

Legislative Special Session on Transportation

A coalition of transportation stakeholders continues to mount pressure for a post-election session on transportation funding and reforms sometime between November 10th and November 30th. The target date at this point is November 10th, two days after the election, when traditional party caucus meetings will be taking place in Sacramento. The date for the session is absolutely critical given the requirements for moving legislation and the obvious intent of limiting the amount of time that legislators need to be present in the Capital City to complete work on a package.

EMPLOYEE RECOGNITION

Deep Grewal, Senior Programmer Analyst, works in the Information Technology (IT) department and serves as the Chair of the Administrative Employees Association (AEA). Deep has shown a great commitment to helping Regional Transit (RT) to improve its financial condition. Over the past few months, Deep worked with the AEA Board and membership to obtain their support of a temporary reduction in the annual merit increase from 5% to 2% for FY2017. Deep is also participating in RT's Cost Containment Task Force, and he recently met with GM/CEO Henry Li to present a list of 19 cost saving ideas, which were developed collaboratively with the AEA membership. One of those cost saving suggestions, an electronic timekeeping system that will reduce staff time in processing timesheets, is planned to be implemented. IT department staff will be meeting in August to begin discussions about this project.

Joe Paglieroni, Senior Grants Analyst, was able to find a creative way to use Sacramento Clean Air Transportation (SECAT) Program funds for operating expenses, which are typically designated as capital funds. Joe's idea spurred a collaborative effort between RT, the Sacramento Metropolitan Air Quality Management District SMAQMD and the Sacramento Area Council of Governments (SACOG) to reallocate \$2.2M in SECAT funds from capital to operating. This reallocation will allow RT to use SECAT funds to enhance transit service to the Golden 1 Center. Joe's idea not only provided RT with an opportunity to enhance service for this major initiative, it also saved RT from implementing the proposed \$1M in service cuts in the FY17 budget.

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




Key Performance Indicators Fare Revenue Comparison



September 2016 to September 2015


FY 2017 YTD to FY 2016 YTD




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Key Performance Indicators Farebox Recovery Comparison




FY 2017 YTD to FY 2016 YTD




