GOVERNMENT AFFAIRS UPDATE

Watt I/80 Transit Center Planning Study

SacRT has partnered with WalkSacramento on the Caltrans Sustainable Communities Planning Grant to provide a master plan for the Watt I/80 Transit Center. The study will develop several concepts for improving the transit center.

Walk Sacramento is preparing for a series of outreach activities to be conducted from October through December (exact dates TBD):

- Visioning meeting (October 24)
- 2 weekend walk audits (first to be October 28)
- Public workshop in November
- Open house in December
- Stakeholder interviews
- On-site public surveys (including talking to bus riders about potential changes to routing); will include on-line survey WalkSacramento is coordinating with SacRT's Marketing Department on outreach notifications. One of the upcoming GM Chats will also discuss this topic.

Meanwhile, SacRT Planning staff is evaluating bus routing options to determine pros and cons of moving the transit center to the Roseville Road station. This will be one of the concepts presented in a final report anticipated to be presented to the Board in January.







Fare Revenue Comparison











Farebox Recovery Comparison













Key Performance Indicators
