Subject: Voting Distribution Update to Account for Annexation of Folsom with Option to Update Voting Distribution for the Inclusion of Citrus Heights Annexation

ISSUE

Whether to conditionally approve a new Vote Allocation for the remainder of Fiscal Year 2019 to reflect new annexations.

RECOMMENDED ACTION

Adopt Resolution No. 18-12-___, Conditionally Approving a New Vote Allocation for Fiscal Year 2019, effective as of January 1, 2019.

FISCAL IMPACT

None as a result of this action.

DISCUSSION

As part of the budget approval process, on June 11, 2018 the Board of Directors, by Resolution 18-06-0063, approved the Vote Allocation for Fiscal Year 2019.

The SacRT Board of Directors and the Folsom City Council have voted to annex the City of Folsom into SacRT. In addition, SacRT approved the annexation of the City of Citrus Heights into SacRT at the November 12, 2018 Board meeting. The Citrus Heights City Council will consider annexation at its December 13, 2018 meeting.

Both draft annexation agreements require the Board of Directors to adopt a new vote allocation prior to the January 1, 2019 effective date of each annexation.

The table below contains the current Vote Allocation as adopted by the Board for Fiscal Year 2019, how it will be after the inclusion of Folsom and Citrus Heights, and how it would be if only Folsom annexes prior to January 1, 2019. Exhibit A and Exhibit B contain the details of how the vote shares were calculated under the methodology specified in the Public Utilities Code (PUC).

PUC and Voting Calculation Methodology

The calculation required by the PUC (Sections 102105.1(d) and 102205) to ascertain the number of votes for each entity contains multiple steps as outlined below:

- The first step in the process is to allocate five "membership incentive votes" to each entity that is annexed to SacRT, up to a maximum of 30 incentive votes, with the remainder of the 100 votes allocated based on financial contribution.
- 2) The next several steps in the process are to determine each agency's financial contribution from four different sources: (a) federal formula grant funds; (b) the Transportation Development Act; (c) funds provided under a "proportionate share" agreement by non-annexed "participating entities"; and (d) other local funds made available to the district by the voting entity for the operation of public transit service. These funding sources do not encompass all of SacRT's operating revenues and there are substantial sources (such as Measure A) that were deliberately excluded from the calculation at the time the legislation was enacted.
- 3) Determining the federal formula grant funds "attributable" to each voting entity is a multistep process: the first step is to ascertain the amount of federal formula grants funds that was available and eligible for use during the prior fiscal year for operating purposes within the Sacramento urbanized area; the second step is to subtract out the amount of federal formula grant funds that was allocated to entities other than SacRT (Note: This figure will vary depending on the entities annexed into SacRT); the third step is to determine each entity's proportionate share of the total population of all voting entities using the population statistics used by the Sacramento Area Council of Governments (SACOG) for TDA purposes; and the final step is to multiply the federal formula grant funds that were available and eligible for use by SacRT for operating purposes during the prior fiscal year by the voting entity's proportionate share of the total population (Note: this calculation results in participating entities receiving an "attribution" of federal funds even if that entity, such as Folsom or Elk Grove, receives its own allocation of federal formula grant funds and those funds are not provided to SacRT).

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- 4) The TDA allocation for each member entity that is reserved for SacRT for operating purposes is determined by the annual SACOG Finding of Apportionment.
- 5) The amount of "proportionate share" contract revenues is determined based on the current contract with the participating entity.
- 6) The amount from any other local funds made available to SacRT by a voting entity for the operation of public transit service is determined by looking at current contracts and agreements between SacRT and all of the voting entities.
- 7) All four funding sources are aggregated to determine the total financial contribution of each entity and then compared to determine each agency's proportionate financial contribution.
- 8) The remaining votes left after deducting the membership incentive votes are then multiplied by each entity's proportionate financial contribution to SacRT.
- 9) The next step is to add the financial contribution votes to the membership votes.
- 10) If the prior calculation results in a fractional number of votes, each fractional vote that is 0.6 or greater is rounded up to the nearest whole number and each fractional vote that is less than 0.6 is rounded down to the nearest whole number.
- 11) If the sum total of votes after rounding is greater than 100, the excess vote or votes are taken one each from the voting entity or entities with the greatest number of total votes, in descending order of the number of votes, until the sum total is 100. If the sum total of votes after rounding is less than 100, one vote is added to the total of the voting entity or entities with the greatest number of total votes, in descending order of the number votes, until the sum total is 100. Ties in either case are determined by drawing lots.

For any voting entity that has appointed more than one member to the Board, the total votes annually allocated to that voting entity are divided equally among the Board members or alternates representing that entity who are present and voting at any given meeting. Where the equal division would result in fractional votes, the votes are divided to the nearest whole number among all members representing the voting entity who are present and voting, with any odd votes being allocated based on seniority on the Board.

CONCLUSION

Based on the methodology described in the PUC, staff has calculated new voting shares that will be applicable if either (1) Folsom and Citrus Heights both annex, as anticipated; or (2) only Folsom annexes.

RECOMMENDATION

Staff requests that the Board conditionally approve a new Vote Allocation, with the determination of which allocation is ultimately adopted being made based on which entities annex January 1, 2019.
