#### DISCUSSION

Earlier this year, a proposed transportation ballot initiative began circulating for signatures in Sacramento County. If it qualifies, it would place a half-cent (1/2) sales tax measure on the November 8, 2022 countywide ballot. The initiative, known as the Sacramento County Transportation Maintenance, Safety, and Congestion Relief Act of 2022—Retail Transactions and Use Tax, is expected to generate \$8.5 billion in local revenue during the forty-year life of the measure (2023-2063). Based on estimates, SacRT is expected to receive over \$3.3 billion over the course of the measure, or approximately \$85 million annually.

Recent court rulings in California have drawn a distinction between tax measures that are proposed by a government body, such as a city council or a school board, and tax measures that are put on the ballot through the citizens' initiative process by voters. Citizens' initiatives only require a simple majority, 50% plus one vote, to pass. Tax measures placed on the ballot by a local public agency require approval by 2/3 of those who vote in the election in order to pass.

## **Citizens' Initiative Process**



- California requires a 2/3 majority of the electorate to approve a sales tax initiative
- A recent legislative exception is that if a ballot measure originates from the voters (Citizens' Initiative), it only requires 50% plus 1 vote to pass
- This exception requires enough valid signatures from voters








# ADA Paratransit / Senior / Disabled Transportation \$250M (3.05%)

80% to SacRT and 20% to eligible transportation agencies

Meeting increased demand for complementary ADA paratransit service for passengers with disabilities unable to use to the fixed-route system

- Improved Service
- Expanded Service
- Improved Efficiencies



## **University of the Pacific Study**

- An academic analysis of the 2020 Expenditure Plan by the University of the Pacific found that the measure would create more than 121,000 jobs over the life of the program
- The analysis also estimated that the expenditure plan would be able to leverage the new local funds to secure more than \$13 billion in state and federal funding
- Analysis was conducted prior to the passage of the historic federal Bipartisan Infrastructure Law, which has increased funding for public transit by more than 55%
