SUBJ: AUTHORIZING THE EXECUTION OF THE LOW CARBON

TRANSIT OPERATIONS PROGRAM PROJECT(S), AND CERTIFICATIONS AND ASSURANCES, AND SUBMITTAL OF PROJECT NOMINATIONS AND ALLOCATION REQUESTS TO

CALTRANS FOR FISCAL YEAR 2022-23 LCTOP.

RECOMMENDATION

Adopt the Attached Resolution.

RESULT OF RECOMMENDED ACTION

Approval of this action will allow the General Manager/CEO to submit and execute the Department of Transportation (Caltrans) FY 22-23 Low Carbon Transit Operations Program (LCTOP) grants for Fiscal Year (FY) 23 and allow SacRT to request \$5,385,154 in funding for the projects included below.

FISCAL IMPACT

Allows the General Manager/CEO to submit allocation request in the amount of \$5,385,154 of LCTOP funds to be used by SacRT in FY24; see Exhibit A below for a complete list of projects. This revenue amount will be included in the adopted FY 23-24 Operating and Capital Budget.

DISCUSSION

The LCTOP is one of several programs that are part of the Transit, Affordable Housing, and Sustainable Communities Program established by the California Legislature in 2014 through Senate Bill 862. The LCTOP was created to provide operating and capital assistance for transit agencies to reduce greenhouse gas emissions and improve mobility, with a priority on serving disadvantaged communities. Approved projects funded by LCTOP will support new or expanded bus or rail services, expand intermodal transit facilities, and may include equipment acquisition, fueling, maintenance, and other costs to operate those services or facilities, with each project reducing greenhouse gas emissions.

The applications totaling \$5,385,154 are for new funding under the LCTOP program. Submission of the application is due by May 1, 2023. Funds are disbursed from the account as costs are incurred and paid. Interest earned on the restricted account balance is also applied to the project.

<u>Description:</u> Funds operation of Smart Ride on-demand microtransit service in three communities, providing corner-to-corner on-demand shared-ride transportation Monday to Friday from 7am to 7pm, with reservations made by phone or the Smart Ride app, fleet comprised of seven CNG-powered 27-foot cutaway buses operated and maintained by SacRT, and standard SacRT fare in effect.
