TRANSPORTATION DEVELOPMENT ACT CLAIM AND

AUTHORIZING THE FILING OF THE FY24 TRANSPORTATION

DEVELOPMENT ACT FUNDS.

RECOMMENDATION

Adopt the Attached Resolution.

RESULT OF RECOMMENDED ACTION

Approval of the attached Resolution will increase fiscal year 2022-23 Transportation Development Act funds (TDA) by \$15,296,260 and authorize the filing of the FY2024 TDA Claim.

FISCAL IMPACT

Approval of the TDA Claim First Amendment will increase the FY23 Capital Budget funding by \$15,296,260 for a total of \$118,482,324.

Approval of the FY24 TDA Claim will add \$28,936,889 of funding for new and existing capital projects and \$97,734,622 to the operating budget. The total FY24 TDA is expected to be \$126,671,511.

This action does not imply funding is available for the projects; however, without approval, requesting the funds is prohibited. The funds referenced above are included in the FY23 amended budget and in the proposed FY24 operating budget.

DISCUSSION

In March 2023, Sacramento Area Council of Governments (SACOG) Board of Directors approved an increase in FY23 TDA allocations to the region. This increase was based upon greater than expected sales tax revenue results and projections through the end of the fiscal year. SacRT's FY23 TDA allocation was increased by \$15,296,260 from an original allocation of \$103,186,064 to a revised allocation of \$118,482,324. SacRT Board approved the First Amendment to SacRT's Operations Budget in March 2023. Approval of this amendment is for SacRT's FY 2022-23 Capital Budget. This amendment is required for SacRT to submit a revised claim to SACOG and receive the additional available funding.

In March 2023, SACOG Board of Directors approved the FY24 TDA allocations to the region. The allocations are based on expected sales tax revenue projections through the end of fiscal year 2024. SacRT's TDA Claim allocation for fiscal year 2024 is \$126,671,511. Approval of this Resolution is required for SacRT to submit a claim to SACOG and receive the FY 2024 funding. Copies of the staff prepared TDA claims have been included in Attachments 1 and 2.
